	14/10/19	30 mph speed limit trial - Urgent requests / questions from Chideock Parish Council	Requests / Questions	Out	Andy Roberts, Highways England	<p>"Chideock Parish Council has the following urgent requests / questions: -</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A new date for the HE / DC Quarterly meeting, to be held as soon as possible. As previously stated, the Bridport A35 meeting is not an adequate substitute for the meetings between Chideock Parish Council, HE and DC. 2. Clarification regarding the provision of speed enforcement in both directions on Chideock hill for the duration of the trial - type, when to be implemented, duration of enforcement, section of highway to be covered. 3. Why is speed monitoring only being conducted for 2 weeks? 4. It is noted that a sign warning of the speed limit change westbound has been erected just past the Village Hall and a VAS installed further up Chideock Hill westbound. However, there is no equivalent sign in advance of the start of the 30 mph limit eastbound at the top of Chideock Hill, nor is there a VAS. Can these please be installed ASAP? 5. How long will HE maintain the trial if it becomes evident that it is not reducing pollution (and maybe even increasing it) and / or is causing additional traffic congestion. 6. When will the Highways England data from the new diffusion tubes, collected BEFORE the speed limit trial started, be made available to Dorset Council AND to Chideock Parish Council? 7. When will the Highways England data from the new diffusion tubes, collected AFTER the speed limit trial started, be made available to Dorset Council AND to Chideock Parish Council? 8. 	17/10/19	30 mph speed limit trial - vehicles speeding up Chideock Hill	Information	In	Chideock Hill resident	<p>" I spent 20 minutes or so this morning taking photos of westbound vehicles speeding (ie travelling faster than 30mph) up the hill out of the village. I sent a sample (I took over 40 pictures in all of drivers flouting the speed limit) to Oliver Letwin and Highways England, along with the suggestion that they position average speed check cameras, covering both directions, at each end of our village. I noticed that drivers disregarded the speed limit when entering the village from the west too (this was made obvious by the braking as vehicles reduced their speed to 30mph as they approached the speed camera by the cemetery. Can you tell me if I should be contacting anyone else with my photographic evidence? "</p>

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	07/10/19	Air Quality - Client Earth	Update	In	Sir Oliver Letwin	<p>"I just wanted to let you know that I recently had a useful meeting with the Client Earth team about the recent court case in Europe and about the current state of play, so far as air quality monitoring in the UK is concerned. I can summarise the position as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The European Court judgement does not, in itself, get us to where we need to be. 2. However, it does provide a basis for Client Earth to challenge HMG (and, ultimately, to take HMG to court in the UK) about the mismatch between the monitoring of air quality by local authorities in a QMA's and the modelling of air quality exceedances done by DEFRA itself. <p>The upshot is that we can hope, in due course, to see the AQMA results incorporated within the DEFRA modelling – leading either to Government action to address exceedances in AQMA's not currently modelled by DEFRA, or at least further court action with the aim of bringing this about."</p>

This has also been noticed by residents.</p> <p>In addition, has any progress been made on persuading HE to release the data from "their" diffusion tubes installed for the speed limit reduction trail? 	22/10/19	Air Quality Data	Resp	In	DC Env Health	<p>"As you're aware, I am working towards collating the new Dorset Council's air quality data within one location on the council's new website. This is still under development, it is hoped that this will be resolved in the near future, as we commence closer collaboration with our new colleagues. I have provided you with updates of monitoring data within Chideock, which the Parish Council may wish to make available to local residents. The most recent results, I processed yesterday & are attached for you.</p> <p>You specifically mention Dorset Council's data - If you would like the data for other areas, I can easily provide to you the former West Dorset District Council data, the former Weymouth and Portland Borough Council data, and the former North Dorset District Council data. The data from the former East Dorset District Council area and former Purbeck District Council area will take a while longer to arrange.</p> <p>As mentioned previously I have requested that all air quality monitoring data owned by Highways England are published, and again I suggest that a request from the Parish Council may assist."</p>	Sent to all + Tony Peacock, David Greenshields and Alan Colville
	06/10/19	Air Quality Funding	Request	Out	Dorset Council Director of Place, Graham Duggan, DCI Head of Community & Public Protection, Kerry Pitt-Kerby, DC Env Health	<p>"Chideock Parish Council trusts that Dorset Council is aware of the additional funding for Air Quality Action which is being provided by Central Government, and that applications can be made from 4 October - 7 November. It is assumed that Dorset Council will be making an application for funding - Chideock is on record as being the place with the worse NO2 pollution in the Dorset Council area, whilst other pollutants, such as particulate matter, are not currently measured."</p>	

	15/10/19	Air Quality Funding	Response	In	Kerry Pitt-Kerby, DC Env Health	<p>"Dorset Council is of course aware of this funding opportunity. The funding is being made available for local authorities to bid for grants to support projects aimed at delivering identifiable improvements in air quality – installing electric vehicle charging points has been cited as an example – and the measures are expected to deliver results within 1-2 years. It is not thought that the funding will be made available for additional monitoring, as local authorities are expected to have been undertaking such activities in accordance with their duties under the Environment Act 1995 and will therefore be familiar with issues within their area.</p> <p>Funding bids are required to meet the strict criteria set out in the scheme documents and of course are not guaranteed to be selected for financial support. In making any application for funding, the council would be required to provide a detailed explanation of how any grant monies would be spent, quantify the air quality improvements which would be expected to be achieved, and confirm that staffing resources will be made available to deliver the project, starting in February 2020. In reality, this means that the council would need to have a fully planned and costed project already in hand now, in order to present for consideration to the funding panel. Given that the A35 is a Trunk route under the control of Highways England ('HE'), the scope for the local authority to implement measures, particularly any which would return very early returns in such a discreet area, is very limited. Highways England has already investigated a number of options such as air quality barriers and single lane traffic platooning and is currently undertaking a trial speed limit reduction with associated monitoring; funding for these actions has already been made available. It is anticipated that the mobile particulate monitoring initiative also in operation will provide early results which would not be achievable with any DEFRA funding, as outlined above.</p> <p>You will be aware that Dorset Council is supporting Highways England with these ongoing projects and for this reason no further projects or schemes have been developed which could be presented for consideration of funding at this time. The council has needed to liaise with bus companies to inform this reply. X51 and X53...</p> <p>The operator of these services, First Wessex, has confirmed that they operate Euro 4 and Euro 5 vehicles on this section. They have stated that there is insufficient revenue generated by these services to upgrade vehicles at this time. A requirement to do so may in their view risk the services being discontinued. The council will always look for opportunities to work with operators to provide vehicles with the most current emission standards having regard to the commercial viability of services.</p> <p>Local school transport provision...</p> <p>The council reviews its requirements when tendering for school transport provision to ensure that vehicle emission standards are appropriately reflected in the procurement.</p> <p>I will ensure that the councils air quality lead officer is made aware of the issues raised.</p> <p>You may be aware that the council has established an Executive Advisory Panel (EAP) for climate change. My comment was generally about the merits of collaborative funding for public transport by town and parish councils. I believe there is a case for looking at a joint approach across the Dorset Council area, but it makes sense to me that Dorset Travel should co-ordinate any such initiative. They have the countywide perspective, and I assume they have officers with expertise on potential funding priorities and costs. I don't think a collaborative approach works unless we look at services for the area as a whole rather than at individual services one-by-one. The latter is likely to be less well co-ordinated and reduces the scope for economies of scale.
